Betty Faye Williamson Allard passed away on July 19, 2022 in Okanogan, Washington after an extended illness.

Betty Williamson was born on July 20, 1948 to Ralph and Ida May (Hunt) Williamson in Toppenish, Washington. She grew up the youngest of four children on the family farm in Wapato. During the daily bus ride to school Betty struck up a friendship with a boy named Gary Allard. They started dating at the end of their senior year and spent most of their courtship writing letters while Gary served in the Coast Guard. They married in 1968 on the island of Oahu where Gary was stationed and lived there the first year of their marriage. In 1969 they had a son, Daniel, and later daughters Jennifer and Anna joined the family. Betty and Gary lived several places during their marriage, finally settling in Omak, WA in 1982 where they remained for the rest of their lives.

Betty was known for her home cooked meals, delicious baking, and hosting family and friends. She was an active volunteer at her children's schools and loved her time spent as a substitute para educator. With her husband Gary she was involved in many local snowmobile and ATV organizations. Betty was a devoted wife and was Gary's full-time caretaker for the last few years of his life. They were married 51 years.

She was preceded in death by her parents Ralph and Ida May Williamson and her siblings Nancy Traub, Raymond Williamson, and Peggy Dale, brother-in-law Herb Dale, her son Daniel, and husband Gary. She is survived by her daughters Jennifer (Brandon) Mayer of Glendive, Montana and Anna (Aaron) Randall of Okanogan, Washington as well as four grandchildren: Jacob and Nathon Randall and Nora and Julia Mayer.

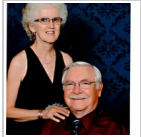
