Wayne Thrapp, 82 of Omak, WA passed away at home October 21, 2022. Wayne was born May 13, 1940 to Roy and Athel Thrapp at Malott, WA. Wayne attended school thru the 8th grade in Malott, WA and graduated High School in 1958 from Okanogan. Wayne married his high school sweetheart Gayle Wagner on August 30th 1958. They were married 64 years at his sudden passing.

Wayne worked at Biles Coleman Lumber for 5 years after high school. Then he decided to fulfill his goal of driving truck. He mainly worked for Figenshaw Transportation for a number of years until he was able to own his own truck. Then in 1989 his son, Greg and him went into business together and formed Thrapp Trucking Inc. In the last few years before retirement he hauled for Tree Top.

Wayne's special place to travel was the Oregon Coast making many trips with wife, Gayle and their special granddaughter Michele who made her 1st trip where she was 5 years old.

Wayne was survived by wife, Gayle of Omak; two sons, Tony of Malott, WA; Greg (Kay) of Republic, WA; granddaughter, Michele (Derek) Denadel and great grandson, Eli of East Wenatchee, WA; and many special nieces and nephews.

Wayne is preceded in death by his parents; brother, Jim; sisters, Betty, Ora, and Jane.

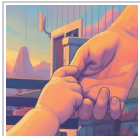
